“Solving Cyber Risk”

The risk paradigm is changing the way we view computer security, and it is a very exciting field. Cyber is not a single peril, but in fact a diverse set of related harms. We do not know how to quantify most of that harm, and thus risk is hard to manage or transfer. However, many parts of cyber security and privacy are quantifiable, and we discuss those as a way to reduce uncertainty within the field.

His research focuses upon technological disasters and the economic impacts of computer security failures or accidents. He has experience of compromising the security of organisations, and assisting them to improve their security postures through a variety of short and long term methods.

Eireann has worked with FIRST.org to establish a cyber insurance special interest group where digital forensics experts can meet with insurers and reinsurers to understand cyber risk. He is the co-author of *Solving Cyber Risk*, which is designed to introduce the reader to the field of cyber risk, in a semi quantified form.



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
